CREDIT BY EXAMINATION THROUGH THE COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM AND DANTES SUBJECT STANDARDIZED TESTS

COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM

- 1. Credit may be granted for satisfactory completion of subject examinations given by the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) of the College Entrance Examination Board, (CEEB). Credit will not be granted by Seattle University for the General Examinations regardless of the scoring level. However, a transferable Associate of Arts degree from a Washington community college which includes General Examination CLEP credit will be honored by Seattle University if the A.A. conforms to the Intercollege Relations Commission Associate of Arts agreement dated 1990 or later.
- 2. Except when used in an A.A. degree, as above, credit will be granted only upon receipt of official test results from CEEB and cannot be transferred from another school's record. Scores may be ordered by the student from College Entrance Examination Board, CLEP Transcript Service, PO Box 6600, Princeton, N.J. 08541. Scores may be ordered by mail only, for \$15. Seattle University's CEEB code is 4695. Information is available at (609) 771-7865 or www.collegeboard.com.
- 3. A maximum of 45 credits may be obtained through such off-campus programs as CLEP, AP, DANTES and the 12 credits allowed for correspondence work. Credit earned through such programs in combination with credits obtained through Seattle University's own credit by examination program shall not exceed a total of 55 quarter hours.
- 4. CLEP credit will be considered community college level and therefore will be subject to the 90 credit limitation. However because these credits are awarded by Seattle University, they cannot be considered transfer credits. (See Policy 77-1)
- 5. Beginning July 2001, the American Council on Education recommends and Seattle University will use, a credit-granting score of 50 (on a 20-80 scale) for all CLEP computer-based examinations except level 2 in the foreign languages. This minimum reflects the mean test score of students who earn a grade of C in the corresponding college courses.
- 6. Credit may be granted by obtaining the score recommended for credit by College Board on the following CLEP subject examinations:
