Direct Transfer Associate Degree (DTA)

Students admitted to Seattle University for the first time who have already completed the Associate in Arts - Option A (DTA) degree awarded by Highline Community College will be granted 90 credits, junior standing, and will have fulfilled university CORE requirements with the exception of philosophy, theology, ethics, upper-division courses and specific requirements for professional degree programs. The degree must meet Inter-College Relations Commission guidelines of 1990 or later.

Courses used to satisfy the direct transfer degree communication skills, quantitative/symbolic reasoning skills, and the lab science requirement must be graded C- (1.5) or better.

Associate of Science – Transfer

Students admitted to Seattle University for the first time who have already completed the Associate of Science (AS-T) awarded by Highline Community College will be granted 90 credits in transfer and junior status. They will receive recognition for the required composition course and at least three humanities/social science courses, and will complete general education requirements (core curriculum) at Seattle University after transfer.

Courses used to satisfy the degree communication skills and quantitative reasoning skills requirements must be graded C- (1.5) or better.

Colleges of Science & Engineering and Nursing

The College of Science and Engineering and the College of Nursing require a minimum grade of C (2.0) in all transferred engineering, math, nursing and science courses that will apply to the major program.

Physics

If a physics series is included in the 90 completed credits, students seeking engineering or physics degrees, the B.S. in Chemistry or the B.S. in Computer Science-General Option or Math Specialization must have the calculus-based physics series.

## **Seattle University Policies Regarding Transfer of Credit**

To fill university core requirements, your transfer course must carry at least **4** quarter credits. When a professional school requires specific courses within the core (e.g. calculus for business majors), students will be obliged to meet these requirements even if transferring with a transferrable associate's degree.

All **independent study, internship, special topics, practicum, and travel** courses are transferable only upon the approval of the student's major department following presentation of a course syllabus.

### **Core Curriculum – Seattle University's general education plan**

Seattle University's new Core Curriculum goes into effect summer, 2013. Beginning summer 2013, all new and continuing students are required to complete the revised Core.

#### **Module I, 6 courses:**

- UCOR 1100 Academic Writing Seminar (W)
- UCOR 1200 Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning (M)
- UCOR 1300 Creative Expression and Interpretation (CE)
- UCOR 1400 Inquiry Seminar in the Humanities (H)
- UCOR 1600 Inquiry Seminar in the Social Sciences (SS)
- UCOR 1800 Inquiry Seminar in the Natural Sciences (NS)

Students may satisfy the Core **Module I** Academic Writing Seminar requirement with a course designated by (W) in the transfer guides; the Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning requirement with a course designated by (M) in the transfer guides; and the Creative Expression and Interpretation requirement with a course designated by (CE) in the transfer guides.

Students who transfer to Seattle University with 36 or more transferable credits will be able to use a broad range of previous credits to satisfy the **Module I** humanities, natural science, and social science requirements.

- Inquiry in Humanities may be satisfied by an acceptable course from: communications, journalism (no writing), speech; literature (no English composition); fine arts, art, drama, music (no skill/performance); history; humanities; philosophy; religion/theology. These courses are designated by (H) in the transfer guides.
- Inquiry in Social Science may be satisfied by an acceptable course from: anthropology; administration of justice/criminal justice; economics; geography; government/political science; psychology; sociology. These courses are designated by (SS) in the transfer guides.
- Inquiry in Natural Science may be satisfied by an acceptable course in a natural science with a lab including astronomy, biology, chemistry, geology, general science, or physics. These courses are designated by (NS) in the transfer guides.

#### **Module III, 3 courses:**

- UCOR 3100 Religion in a Global Context (R)
- Global Challenges, ordinarily two are required, to be determined upon admission based on each student's major:
  - UCOR 3400 Humanities and Global Challenges (H)
  - UCOR 3600 Social Sciences and Global Challenges (SS)
  - UCOR 3800 Natural Sciences and Global Challenges (NS)

With 90 transfer credits the **Module III** requirement Religion in a Global Context is waived. Students with less than 90 transfer credits may satisfy this requirement by completing an equivalent course designated by (R) in the transfer guides. Ordinarily, two Global Challenges courses must be completed at SU. Students with a transferable associate's degree are waived from one Global Challenges course. Students with 90 acceptable credits but no transferable associate's degree may satisfy one Global Challenges course in transfer, determined upon admission and based on each student's major. This course must be in a different discipline than the course used to satisfy a Module I Inquiry requirement.

### **Modules II and IV must be completed at SU.**

- **Modules II, 3 courses:**
  - UCOR 2100 Theological Explorations
  - UCOR 2500 Philosophy of the Human Person
  - UCOR 2900 Ethical Reasoning
- **Module IV, 1 course:**
  - Senior Synthesis/Departmental Capstone

A transfer course cannot satisfy more than one Core requirement.

## 90 Credit Limit

Credits are transferred in chronological order, earliest courses first. Once you have accumulated a total of 90 credits from all schools, including Seattle University, additional community college credits may not be transferred. Courses taken at a community college beyond the 90 limit, if applicable to the SU degree, will not have to be repeated and can fill content requirements, but credits do not transfer and such courses will not reduce the minimum additional 90 required for your SU degree.

## Grade Requirements for Course Transfer

Courses in transfer must be graded "C" (2.0 on the decimal system) or better if they are to apply to major requirements in the Albers School of Business and Economics, the College of Nursing, the College of Science and Engineering and to specifically required courses in the psychology, communication studies, and journalism/strategic communications majors in the College of Arts and Sciences.

The minimum acceptable grade for a transferring course is C-, or 1.5 on the decimal system. This does not alter the statement above regarding a higher minimum for major requirements in many programs.

Courses to be used toward the major or to fill university core or college requirements should not be taken by correspondence or on the pass/fail or credit/no credit basis.

## Second Language Requirement

The university does not have a second language admission requirement. However, all students with a major in the College of Arts and Sciences have a second language requirement for graduation: one college year of a single foreign language or proficiency to that level as shown by departmental testing. International students who were required to submit TOEFL scores at the time of admission are assumed to have completed this language requirement. Since summer 2000, 15 credits of American Sign Language will satisfy this college requirement.

## New Programs at Seattle University

New majors in cell and molecular biology and marine and conservation biology are available through the College of Science and Engineering beginning summer 2012. A major in digital design is available through the College of Arts and Sciences also beginning summer 2012.

## Use of this Guide

This transfer guide lists courses in Washington community colleges which are judged parallel, though not necessarily equivalent, to courses taught at Seattle University. Also included are those courses which have no parallel at S.U., but which will be accepted as elective credit or under the specific conditions indicated. The "X" designation is used for elective credit throughout this guide. Where applicable, a course may be designated as a departmental elective, e.g. BIOL X, SOCL X, or ART X. In general, technical, vocational, remedial or any courses numbered below 100 do not transfer. In this guide only courses which will transfer are listed; courses not listed should be presumed non-transferable to SU. Courses listed on the transfer guide are parallel in terms of content only; 100- and 200-level community college courses cannot transfer as upper-division courses.

This guide is designed to be used with the current version of Seattle University's Online Catalog, available at <http://seattleu.edu/registrar>, which describes courses and lists academic regulations on acceptance of transfer credit. The guide is also designed to be used with the community college catalog that bears the date listed at the column head. A college catalog does not always provide sufficient or reliable information concerning the scope of particular course offerings; therefore, this transfer guide, which uses the catalog as a primary source, should not be viewed as the only authority on course transferability.
