



### Undergraduate Students

- ~ Undergraduate students must have declared a major in Criminal Justice.
- ~ Must have a minimum cumulative G.P.A of 3.0.
- $\sim$  Must have a minimum G.P.A of 3.2 in Criminal Justice courses.
- $\sim$  Should be in the process of completing 4 criminal justice courses.

#### Graduate Students

- ~Graduate students must be enrolled in a Criminal Justice graduate program.
- $\sim$  Have a minimum G.P.A of 3.4.
- $\sim$  Should be in the process of completing 4 Criminal Justice courses.
