


Guidelines for completing your Educational Planning Worksheet

- At this point, you have reviewed the information on the Educational Planning webpages, and you should have the following materials in front of you...



...and have these 2 websites available to refer to

- Begin by entering the courses in which you are already registered (for Fall 2012) onto the planning grid.
- Next, map out your courses for each quarter through your senior year

Determine the courses you don't need to take: Review your **Program Evaluation** and identify the major or core courses you have already satisfied and cross them off of your **Typical Program of Study**.

Enter the remaining courses onto your planning grid:

The sample Program of Study plan for your major is a *typical* one. Use the plan as a guide for how to sequence your courses. At the same time, use what flexibility you have* scheduling courses into particular quarters—as long as you are satisfying your requirements, maintaining course sequencing, and taking any prerequisites you need.

Your plan is a work in progress. Creating a quarterly course schedule to graduation at this time does not prevent you from making changes to your plan at anytime.

Experiment with your plan. Try out a different major. Add a second major or minor to see how it will affect your course plan – or these options fit into your graduation timeline.

*Majors in Business, Pre-professional majors, and Nursing have more fixed schedules.

- **About entering specific courses and times**

As you enter your courses in the upcoming Winter and Spring quarters, you can get a sense of what courses will be offered by using the search for classes function on **SU Online** (<https://suonline.seattleu.edu/>). Some of these class offerings may change and you'll need to be flexible when it's time to register. Having a plan will make it be easier to be adaptable.

- **Planning for Co-Curricular experiences**

Keep in mind that activities you want to pursue during and after university (a minor, study abroad, internship, graduate school, etc.) will assist you in mapping out classes for your you remaining time here. This information will also assist advisors in referring you to other helpful resources. You may need to incorporate the classes you need for certain co-curricular activities in your plan.
