- are an international student on an F-1 visa and have missed one or more quarters other than Summer Quarter.
- have been a non-matriculated student at SU and now wish to pursue degree-seeking or certificate-seeking status.
- are applying for either the Nursing or Diagnostic Ultrasound majors and have missed one or more quarters other than Summer Quarter.

There is no application fee for readmission. Written notification of readmission decisions are communicated by mail.

Completed readmit applications must be postmarked by the following dates:

Winter Quarter.....November 1  
Spring Quarter.....January 1  
Summer Quarter.....May 1  
Fall Quarter .....August 1

Students should carefully consult specific program requirements as some programs may have earlier deadlines, or not admit students for all quarters of entry.

Readmission applications are generally valid only for the quarter originally indicated. If you wish to apply for a subsequent quarter other than the one you originally applied for, please contact the Undergraduate Readmission Coordinator.

Receipt of official transcripts and supporting documents is required by the readmission deadline date. The forwarding of transcripts is the applicant's responsibility. All records received become the property of Seattle University and cannot be returned or sent to third parties.

Credits for courses completed elsewhere may be transferred under the conditions listed in the current Bulletin of Information.
