The Hedreen Gallery is pleased to announce the culminating events of *Sweated*, an exhibition of new work by Seattle artist Wynne Greenwood. *Sweated* marks the second installment of a trilogy series that comprise the exhibition *Void-Blank-Blank Void Sweated Blank*, a year-long investigation by three individual artists of the gallery's distinct character as both an exhibition space and a theatre lobby.

Sweated opened at the Hedreen Gallery on April 2, and was followed with *Sister Taking Nap* a performance by Greenwood at *On the Boards*, April 15-19.

It's curtains...

As the closing of Greenwood's installation *Sweated* draws near, the Hedreen Gallery presents a series of related events intended to question the nature of attempting to define something. Over the next two weeks the artist will make herself available for conversation while completing elements of the exhibition during public work sessions in the gallery. During these public work days, Greenwood will use video images to project words, the beginning of letters, and patterns onto the curtains. She will interact with the physical objects in the space. These actions, in effect, complete the shapes and designs on the back curtains.

In doing so, the artist will affect the curtains in temporary ways, attempting to articulate their past, present and future meanings and the meaning of the spaces—both physical and mental—they occupy. These events will culminate in a presentation of this exploration that includes pre-recorded and live voice, video and sound.

Artist Bio:

Wynne Greenwood (born 1977) lives and works in Seattle, WA. Greenwood received her MFA in 2004 from the Milton Avery Graduate School for the Arts at Bard College. She is a video artist, musician, and performance artist creating feminist interactions. After studying video production and art history at Rutgers University, New Jersey, in the late 90's Greenwood moved back to her home state of Washington and began performing the punk band Tracy + The Plastics in 2001. Ending the project in 2006, Greenwood continues to explore the relationships between and within video and live space, through sculpture, music and installations. Greenwood's work has been performed and exhibited extensively internationally including at: Susanne Vielmetter Berlin and Los Angeles; The Moore Space, Miami; The Kitchen, NYC; Reena Spaulings Fine Arts; TATE, London; Walker Art Center; Hammer Museum; The Frye Art Museum; and The Whitney Museum of American Art in its 2004 Whitney Biennial. In 2008 she was awarded The Stranger Genius Award for Visual Arts. She is represented by Susanne Vielmetter.
