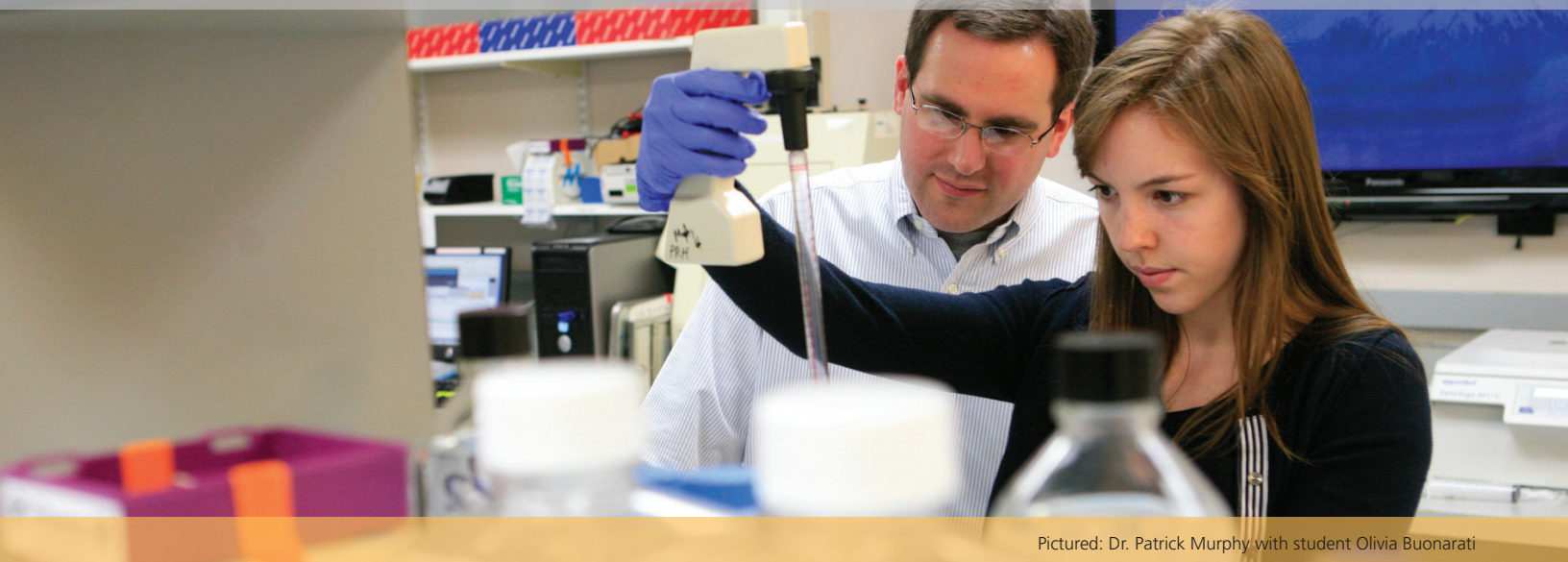


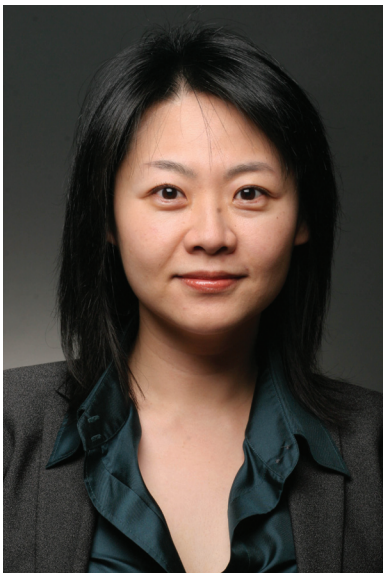

Jean Tang Named John A. Hartford Foundation Claire M. Fagin Fellow and awarded NINR Post-Doctoral fellowship



Jean Tang, associate professor of nursing, was selected as a 2011-2013 John A. Hartford Foundation Claire M. Fagin Fellow. The John A. Hartford Foundation Claire M. Fagin Fellow Program focuses on building academic geriatric nursing capacity through the development of leaders in gerontological nursing. The selection process for this fellowship is very competitive. Last year, only eight awards were given out in the nation.

In addition, to the honor of becoming a Hartford Fellow, Dr. Tang was also awarded a National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR) sponsored post-doctoral research fellowship with University of Pennsylvania. The research

training program emphasizes individualized care for at-risk older adults. Her research title is *Multi-Faceted Audio-Relaxation Program for Older Adults with Comorbid Hypertension and Insomnia*. Dr. Tang will be working with the internationally renowned cardiovascular health researcher, Dr. Barbara Riegel. Riegel is a professor at University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing and the co-editor of *The Journal of Cardiovascular Nursing*.

Dr. Tang is also a practicing Adult Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner. She has taught at Seattle University in the College of Nursing since 2005 and was tenured and promoted to Associate Professor in 2011.

Alums Published in AAOHN Journal

Nursing alums, Elisa Apostle and Marykate O'Connell (BSN Jun '10) had a manuscript published that they began in their Senior Synthesis course at SU. The manuscript entitled *Coal Mining Health Disparities and the Need for Occupational Health Nurses* was accepted without revision by the American Association of Occupational

Health Nurses Journal (AAOHN). The AAOHN has also requested to use it as a continuing education offering. This is a remarkable accomplishment for the first submission by new BSN graduates. 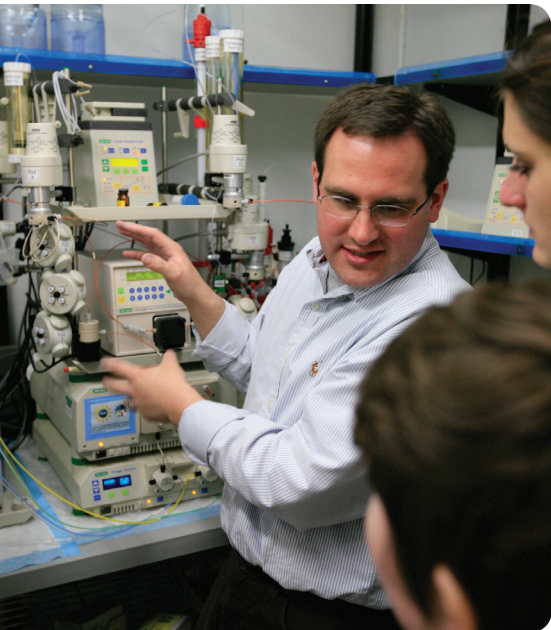

Patrick Murphy and colleagues in the Biology, Chemistry and Mechanical Engineering Departments co-author, *MRI: Acquisition of an FPLC Liquid Chromatography System for Biomolecule Purification*



An interdisciplinary consortium of Seattle University faculty have obtained funding for a Bio-Rad DuoFlow liquid chromatography biomolecule purification system to support programs in faculty mentored undergraduate research, laboratory instruction, interdepartmental collaboration, and scientific community outreach. Faculty members from four departments (Biology, Chemistry, Nursing, and Mechanical Engineering) co-authored the grant and have proposed utilizing the instrument for a diverse array of projects, all of which focus on essential questions of biological significance while promoting the training of future scientists and professionals. Faculty research enabled by the new instrument has already been translated back into the classroom by use in laboratory classes in support of Seattle University's educational

mission. The instrument provides research training to students on a state-of-the-art industry-standard purification system. It enables us to supply highest quality practical experience for undergraduates continuing on to graduate school or obtaining technical positions in the biotechnology industry. For example, student-faculty research teams are currently using the instrument to purify protein complexes involved in intracellular signaling in healthy mammalian cells. All faculty research projects are substantially conducted by undergraduate researchers and involve opportunities for students themselves to function in mentoring and training capacities.

Lori Cray contributing to NIH-funded project on women's health



College of Nursing Assistant Professor, Lori Cray, received a sub-award from the University of Washington to participate in research funded by the National

Institutes of Health. Cray will apply her expertise in latent class analysis and causal modeling as she collaborates with UW researchers to improve women's health. The research to which Cray is contributing, "Menopause Symptom Clusters: Refocusing Therapeutics," shifts the paradigm by which menopause research has typically been conducted. Although women experi-

ence clusters of symptoms during the menopausal transition, most research has focused on individual symptoms such as hot flashes. Cray and the other researchers will instead investigate clusters of symptoms experienced during menopause.

The current study is a secondary data analysis of the longitudinal Seattle Midlife Women's Health Study that collected data from over 500 participants over a 15 year period beginning in the early 1990's. The purpose of this analysis is to: 1) identify prevalent symptom clusters during the late reproductive stage, early and late menopausal transition stages, and early post-menopause using latent class analysis; 2) determine the consistency

of symptom clusters as women change from one menopausal transition stage to the next; 3) test models linking genetic polymorphisms, endocrine biomarkers, symptom vulnerability factors, social-behavioral risk factors and menopause-related factors to symptom clusters, and outcomes of well-being and symptom interference; 4) conduct a systematic review of controlled clinical trials to identify symptoms as secondary treatment effects and adverse effects that will inform us about therapies for symptom clusters and 5) synthesize results of the empirical analyses and systematic review to develop novel symptom cluster management protocols to be tested in future feasibility studies.
