Curriculum Notes

- All Albers courses require a C- or better including Math 1130 or 1334. Transfer credit for Albers courses requires a C or better.
- Students that do not place into Math 1130 or 1334 will use general elective credits to complete the prerequisites: Math 1000 and/or Math 1010/1021.
- To be able to register in 3000/4000 level business courses, students need to have completed 60 credits, have completed Calculus, ECON 2100 and four of the following courses: ACCT 2300, ACCT 2310, ECON 2110, ECON 2130 and BCOM 2800.
- MGMT 4890 requires the completion of all other business courses except for Finance major courses.
- Students must earn a B- or better grade in FINC 3400 to continue in the Finance major.
- Excel Level I Certification must be completed before graduation.
- See current 2-Year Projected Course Offerings for major electives.
