Curriculum Notes

- All Albers courses require a C- or better including Math 1130 or 1334. Transfer credit for Albers courses requires a C or better.
- Students that do not place into Math 1130 or 1334 will use general elective credits to complete the prerequisites: Math 1000 and/or Math 1010/1021.
- BAE.IED students pursuing the specialization in International Economic Development must complete a min. of 15 and max. of 20 ECON elective credits focused on IED. IED students must complete one Supplemental Activity pre-approved by the Dept. of Economics Chair: Internship with a government agency or NGO involved with international economic development; a minimum of one quarter (15 credits) of related studies in an acceptable program in a developing country; participation in Summer Education Abroad Course or campus ministry tour to a developing country; participation in SU's Int'l Dev. Intern. Program (also satisfies one IED major elective).
- BAE students must complete a minimum of 10 ECON elective credits not focused on IED.
- Excel Level I Certification must be completed before graduation.
