Transfer credit for Albers courses requires a C or better.</li> <li>Students that do not place into Math 1130 or 1334 will use general elective credits to complete the prerequisites: Math 1000 and/or Math 1010/1021.</li> <li>All 3000/4000 level business courses require Advanced Standing which consists of the completion of 75 credits, 2.25 minimum GPA, Calculus, ECON 2100 and four of the following courses: ACCT 2300, ACCT 2310, ECON 2110, ECON 2130, BCOM 2800.</li> <li>MGMT 4890 requires the completion of all other business courses except for International Business major courses.</li> <li>INBU majors must complete two Supplemental Activities pre-approved by INBU Program Director: Internship in int'l business; foreign language through the 1350 level; approved study abroad program; approved Summer Education Abroad Course; Int'l. Econ. Development or Int'l. Studies minor. International students may have different requirements.</li> <li>Excel Level I Certification must be completed before graduation.</li> <li>See current 2 Year Projected Course Offerings for major electives.</li> </ul>
