## Important Major Information

- Credits in Major: 65
- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements: 20 credits
  - HIST 1200, 1210 or 2310
  - Modern Language 1150, 1250, 1350 or demonstrated proficiency
- INTA Electives: 25 credits, choose from ART, ARTD, ARTH, ARTL, MUSC, PHOT, or THTR. 10 of these credits must be from a discipline other than arts leadership (ARTL) and 10 must be taken at the 3000-4000 level.
- ARTL majors must complete at least 20 credits in the major at Seattle University.
