Important Major Information

- Credits in Major: 87
- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements: 20 credits
 - HIST 1200, 1210 or 2310
 - Modern Language 1150, 1250, 1350 or demonstrated proficiency
- 9 credits of 3000/4000 level ART/ARTD/ARTH/PHOT electives required. May include 5 credits from the following: FILM 3400*, 3420*, 4400*, 4420* or 4450.
- Documentary Emphasis: Students who wish to pursue an emphasis in documentary photography will satisfy the 9 credit major elective requirement by completing documentary photography/film classes as approved by the student's advisor for the photography major.
- Faculty will review the student portfolio upon completion of sophomore year, or equivalent, to determine eligibility to continue in the photography major.
