Important Major Information

- Credits in Major: 65
- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements: 20 credits
 - HIST 1200, 1210 or 2310
 - Modern Language 1150, 1250, 1350 or demonstrated proficiency
- 30 credits of Film Studies electives chosen from the 3100-4900 level, at least one of which must be at the 4000 level, in addition to Film Theory
- 5 credits of Film Genre electives. Options include: FILM 3210, 3220, 3230, 3240, 3250, 3260, 3270, 3280, 3290 or 3910 (subject specific).
- 5 credits of Visual Storytelling electives. Options include: FILM 3300, 3320, 3330, 3350, 3360, 3400, 3420, 3820, 3910 (subject specific), 4400, 4450, or 4910 (subject specific).
- 5 credits of International Cinema electives. Options include: FILM 3530, 3600, 3620, 3630, 3640, 3650, 3660, 3670, 3680, 3690, 3710, 3720, or 3910 (subject specific).
- 5 credits of Special Topics electives. Options include: FILM 3800, 3910 (subject specific), 4510, 4511, 4512, 4513, 4514, 4540, 4550, 4560, or 4910.
- The FILM senior capstone project consists of a reflective essay and portfolio of 3 works previously created for classes over the course of the degree. Please consult with the Director of the program for more details.
- A required course may not be used to satisfy two requirements simultaneously. Courses used to satisfy major or college requirements may not simultaneously fulfill Core requirements.
