Additional Information

- **Area of Concentration** – Choose one in consultation with your academic advisor:
 - Concentration in a single discipline (40 credits)
 - Concentration in a pre-professional area (e.g., pre-medical, pre-dental, pre-law, nursing, business, engineering, etc.) (45)
 - Concentration in a coordinated split discipline (20/20)

Important Major Information

- Credits in Humanities Core: 75
- Credits in Humanities major (includes Area of Concentration): 45-50
- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements (Modern Language and History) are not required for the Humanities degree unless you double degree in another College of Arts and Sciences degree.
- **Adding a Second Degree:**
 - A second degree can be earned with the Humanities degree, changing the minimum required credits to 180.
 - Generally, a second degree can be earned with addition of 35-45 credits in the fourth year.
 - The Humanities Core replaces the University Core in the student's second degree.
