- Endorsement Area is the subject area you would like to teach.
- For students interested in teaching at the secondary level, it is recommended to double major or minor in the subject you would like to teach.
- Generally, this is a 4 + 1 model: 4 years for the BA in Humanities for Teaching, and 1 year for a Masters in Teaching graduate degree, which includes a teaching certificate.

- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements (Modern Language and History) are not required for the Humanities for Teaching major, unless you double major in another College of Arts and Sciences major.
