To be acceptable, the student must complete: a) A minimum of two quarters or one semester in an approved program abroad; b) Successfully complete the equivalent of 20 quarter credits or 15 semester credits abroad; c) At least two 4000-level classes (10 credits) must be taken at SU; d) 4000-level major electives taken on study abroad programs should incorporate a literature emphasis (or as otherwise approved by department).
