In consultation with your academic advisor, 10 of these credits must be from a discipline other than music (MUSC) and 10 must be taken at the 3000-4000 level.</li> <li>• Students majoring in interdisciplinary arts may not earn a second degree or major within their specialization discipline.</li> <li>• MUSC majors must complete at least 20 credits in the major at SU. Performing Arts transfer credits are subject to review which may include portfolio review, audition, exam and/or interview.</li> <li>• Additional MUSC entrance requirements are necessary. Speak with Performing Arts and Arts Leadership Department for more details.</li> </ul>
