## Important Major Information

- Credits in Major: 65
- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements: 20 credits
  - HIST 1200, 1210 or 2310
  - Modern Language 1150, 1250, 1350 or demonstrated proficiency
- Interdisciplinary Arts majors with a Specialization in Music must identify a specific area of musical practice: voice, piano, or string instrument.
- 5 credits each of MUSC Lessons and MUSC Ensemble will be scheduled in consultation with your academic advisor.
- INTA electives: 30 credits. Choose from ART, ARTD, ARTH, ARTL, MUSC, PHOT, or THTR. 10 of these credits must be from a discipline other than music (MUSC) and 10 must be taken at the 3000-4000 level.
- Students majoring in interdisciplinary arts may not earn a second degree or major within their specialization discipline.
