More Information

Connecting to SU_wireless

Please follow the steps below for your specific device. Failure to configure the suggested settings will prevent your device from displaying the web login screen where you must authenticate in order to obtain wireless access including internet access.

Apple iPhone or iPad

- 1. Go to Settings > Wi-Fi
- 2. Click on the blue Information icon next to SU wireless
- 3. Set Auto-Join to OFF
- 4. Set Auto-Login to OFF (This is a required setting for SU_wireless)
- 5. Ensure SU_wireless is still selected as the target wireless network
- 6. Close Settings
- 7. Proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.

Apple MacBook, MacBook Pro, MacBook Air

- 1. If you have a Firefox or Chrome browser installed use either as those work well with the web login portal. Firefox or Chrome users proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.
- 2. Using the Safari browser may require additional configuration:
- a. After connecting to SU_wireless, Open safari and enter the following url in your address bar: wifilogin.seattleu.edu. If the login page appears, proceed to the Web Login section on the following page. Otherwise continue with the following configuration steps.
- b. Close Safari
- c. On your Mac, go to Applications > Utilities > Keychain Access
- d. From the Keychain Access menu at the top left of the screen choose Preferences
- e. Click on the Certificates tab
- f. Set Online Certificate Status Protocol to OFF
- g. Set Certificate Revocation List to OFF
- h. Close Keychain Access
- i. Open Safari
- j. Proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.

Windows version 7, 8, or 10

- 1. Select SU_wireless from the detected list of wifi networks. Make sure Connect automatically is not checked.
- 2. Connect to SU wireless.
- 3. Proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.

Android devices

- 1. Select SU_wireless from the detected list of wifi networks.
- 2. Select 'Connect' when prompted.
- 3. Proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.

More Information

Devices using static IP or DNS settings

Static IP or DNS settings are not allowed on SU_wireless. Having static IP or DNS settings will prevent your device from connecting to SU_wireless.

- 1. Remove any static IP or DNS settings and set your device to DHCP
- 2. Disconnect and reconnect to SU wireless
- 3. Proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.

Devices using Avast antivirus

This application uses a service called SecureDNS which is blocked by the SeattleU firewall. To use SU_wireless you must disable SecureDNS as follows:

- 1. Open Avast
- 2. Browse to Avast > Settings > Active Protection > Secure DNS
- 3. Set Secure DNS to OFF
- 4. Close Avast
- 5. Proceed to the Web Login section on the following page.

Web Login (User Identification Portal)

- 1. Once your device has connected to SU_wireless, open a web browser and browse to wifilogin.seat-tleu.edu. Do not browse to an https:// URL or you will not receive the web login screen. The following login screen should appear within 30 seconds:
- 2. Enter the account username and password provided by your event host
- 3. Click Login. If valid credentials are entered, the system will authenticate you and display the current hostname and IP address of your machine.
- 4. Continue browsing and using applications as you would normally.

If you are still unable to connect or login to SU_wireless after configuring your device according to the recommendations in this document, you can contact the ITS HelpDesk at 206-296-5571 or via email at helpdesk@seattleu.edu. Opening a support ticket with the Help Desk requires you provide the following information:

- * Your first and last name
- * Your guest account or wireless access username (i.e. 'g-guestuser' or 'm-guestuser')

- * The web browser used
- * An explanation of the step that isn't working as expected
