This includes psycho-therapy, client advocacy, outreach and/or follow-up contacts to clients in the community. Assist with funding issues, vocational services, housing, health care services and other community social services as to the needs of the client. Participate in data collection, studies and research projects.

Mental Health Practitioner, Medical Respite Program

Provide case management for medical respite patients which includes psychosocial needs assessment, accessing mental health services, chemical dependency services, state benefits (DSHS and/or SSI) and assistance with legal issues. Facilitate discharge plans with patients and other community providers. Provide assistance with shelter and housing referrals. Facilitate placement of clients in nursing homes, adult family homes and community living homes (group homes). Accompany patients to appointments and agencies as needed. Participate in community meetings and provide presentations regarding the medical respite program.

Provide case management services to mentally ill and chemical dependent clients tiered in the RSN. Case management services provided, but not limited to: assist with housing and medication needs, symptom management, assist with budgeting, applying for medical and other state/government funding. Responsible for records, treatment plans and RSN tier. Facilitator of Women's MICA Group, MICA Phase I and Phase II Group.
