Experience

Community Based Program Supervisor – Seneca Family of Agencies – Washington 6/20 - Present

- Build and develop the Seneca WA Outpatient Clinic for children and youth ages 5-18 in south King County
- Oversee the Commercially Sexually Exploited Children Outreach Program which provides consultation, training, and prevention groups throughout King County
- Collaborate in the development of the Seneca WA Community Based program which encompasses the Outpatient Clinic, CSEC Outreach Program, the Juvenile Justice Assessment Team, and Wraparound Intensive Services as well as a 24 hour on call crisis system
- Monitor and direct all phases of treatment in the outpatient clinic including eligibility, referral, intake, assessment, treatment planning, interventions, discharge
- Supervise and support outpatient therapists and interns in both programmatic and clinical aspects of the job through weekly individual and group supervision

- InTandem (therapeutic day school) Clinical Program Supervisor, supporting clinical team with weekly program meeting, meeting internal documentation deadlines, crisis support, time off requests, case assignments and support around clinical role and duties

- Created and continued monitoring of team treatment planning model, including bi-weekly full team meetings, data collection and documentation for each client at InTandem

- Approve clinical documentation in accordance with agency and King County Medicaid guidelines
