Curriculum Notes

- The INST major requires a learning program in a country other than the U.S. An
 acceptable <u>study abroad experience</u> for the INST major includes a minimum of 15
 quarter credits, or the equivalent in semester credits, provided that the student meets
 full-time status in the chosen study abroad program. This requirement may be waived
 due to Covid-19 restrictions.
- Students educated to the age of 16 in schools outside the United States may request a waiver of the INST study abroad requirement.
- INST Electives: Choose a total of 15 credits of approved electives as found in the Course Catalog and listed on the <u>INST department website</u>, in consultation with your academic advisor.
- Students who place out of a second year of language (2000-level) must take 30 credits of INST major electives instead of 15 credits.
