

## Spanish Minor

To earn a minor in Spanish, students must complete **35 credits** in Spanish including:

The minor in Spanish requires 20 credits of SU courses and a Learning Program in a Spanish speaking country for the equivalent of 15 quarter credits.

## Spanish Major

To earn a Major in Spanish, students must complete **55 credits** in Spanish, including:

## Study Abroad Requirements

The Spanish Major requires 20 credits of SU courses and a Learning Program in a Spanish-speaking country.

- A minimum of two quarters or one semester and successfully complete 20 quarter credits abroad.
- At least two 4000 level classes (10 credits) must be taken at SU .
- 4000-level Major electives taken on study abroad programs must incorporate an emphasis on literature (or as otherwise approved by the Spanish department).

### Note:

- \* SPAN 3150 and 3250 can be taken at SU or abroad.

## The Program

The **Latin American Studies Program** falls in the winter and spring quarters at Seattle University. Students are housed with Mexican families, which brings them especially close to the culture of the host country. The program requires at least one year of college-level Spanish prior to participation.

Classes will be held at the Universidad Iberoamericana, the Golfo-Centro Campus, a prestigious Jesuit university of about 5,000 students in Southwestern Puebla. Students will attend classes three hours daily. (Monday through Friday). All classes will be conducted in Spanish. Apart from classes, educational excursions to Mexico City and Oaxaca are scheduled during winter quarter. A two-week field trip through Chiapas and the Yucatan Peninsula takes place at the end of spring quarter.

## Academics

The Latin American Studies Program (LASP) in Puebla, Mexico, will follow the regular Seattle University Winter and Spring Quarter schedules. Students are advised to arrive in Puebla at least 2 days before classes start.

Students can earn credits towards Seattle University's Major or Minor in Spanish, Minor in Latin American Studies or Major in International Studies while studying in Puebla, México.

# PUEBLA

Puebla, city capital of Puebla State, central Mexico. It's official name is Heroica Puebla de Zaragoza, who defeated the French forces there in 1862.

Located in a highland valley, it is an important agricultural, commercial, and manufacturing center, as well as a popular tourist spot. The site of México's first textile-producing factory, Puebla has cotton mills, an automobile factory, onyx quarries, pottery and food industries.



The city is noted for the colored tiles that decorate its buildings and numerous churches, as well as the ones near Cholula. The cathedral, built between 1552 and 1649, is one of the finest in Mexico; the theater, constructed in 1790, is said to be the oldest on the continent.

Founded in 1535 as Puebla de Los Ángeles, the city was historically a link between the coast and Mexico City. It was taken (1847) by U.S. Gen. Winfield Scott during the Mexican War. French troops captured Puebla in 1863 but were ousted by Porfirio Díaz in 1867.
