- INST major electives: choose 15 credits from approved courses (at least five credits must be designated Non-western Humanities)
- Public Affairs Concentration (15 credits): Students are required to take at least three courses in a particular area of interest. This program of study assumes students will earn PUBA students a concentration in International Development. Courses will be determined with consent of the student's major advisor.
- PUBA 4950 or INST 4950, Internship, must have an international orientation
- Students who place out of a second year of language (2000-level) must take 30 credits of INST major electives instead of 15 credits.
