A special education endorsement prepares educators to work directly with students who have a range of disabilities, including learning disabilities, attention problems, behavioral concerns, developmental disabilities and autism spectrum disorder.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for whom English is a non-native language must demonstrate English proficiency with a minimum TOEFL score of 580 (92 internet-based or 237 computer-based score), Pearson Test of English (63%) or IELTS (7.0) score.
