PROGRAM OF STUDY

Master in Teaching: 60 credits, 1 year



The Master in Teaching (MIT) program at Seattle University is a full-time, cohort-based degree program in teacher education that offers both a master's degree in teaching and a Washington State Residency Teaching Certificate. Endorsements offered include English Language Learners, elementary education, middle school, and many secondary education content areas.

Through integrated course work and field experiences, students develop the insight and skills needed to be effective educators in a complex and technological world. Because MIT graduates are recognized as outstanding educational leaders, they are in high demand throughout the region.

ADMISSION APPLICATION & REQUIREMENTS

SU Online Application and:

- Endorsement Verification Form
- Corresponding WEST-E/WEST-B/NES/ACTFL test(s) or accepted alternative
- Autobiographical statement
- 30-minute, online writing sample
- Two College of Education Recommendation Forms affirming prior work in schools or other education settings
- College of Education Self-Evaluation Form
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- Official transcript(s)
- Minimum GPA of 3.0

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for whom English is a non-native language must demonstrate English proficiency with a minimum TOEFL score of 580 (92 internet-based or 237 computer-based score), Pearson Test of English (63%) or IELTS (7.0) score.
