- 2) Pass the NES tests for Elementary Education – Elementary Education Subtest 1 and Elementary Education Subtest 2.
- 3) Complete this form including coursework that you plan to complete prior to the beginning of the MIT Program.¹ We do not assume that you will have coursework in all areas. If a course title does not specifically identify a content area, submit additional documentation. Acceptable documentation includes 1) copy of the catalog course description including the front cover of the catalog, indicating the name of the institution and year course was taken, 2) syllabus, or 3) letter from the department chair.
- 4) Submit this affidavit, any verification documents, and transcripts at the time of the application.
- 5) Note: Additional coursework for this endorsement, **not** listed on this form will be completed in the program.
