<b>Federal &amp; State Aid</b>	Regardless of whether studying on SU campus or abroad, students will receive <b>2 quarters of Federal &amp; State Aid</b> towards Spring Semester abroad or Winter & Spring Quarters.		
<b>SU Scholarships &amp; Grants</b>	Students studying abroad on this program for Spring Semester will only receive <b>1 quarter of SU aid as opposed to 2</b> (one quarter's worth of SU aid per semester abroad). Divide annual award by 3 to determine how much SU aid will be applied towards one semester abroad; multiply annual award by 2/3 to determine how much SU aid would be applied towards Winter & Spring Quarters on SU campus.
