What does a representative DO?

❖ **Attend monthly General Assembly meetings**

Complete a monthly report for the GSC (to be turned in the night before each meeting) outlining updates from the graduate college/demographic/social concern you represent

Participate as a voting member of the Council, helping form policy, advocate for students, and plan events

❖ **Participate in the planning and execution of GSC community events**

❖ **Represent your graduate college/demographic/social concern to University administration**

For college reps, this entails serving as a liaison between the Council and the dean of your graduate college

For demographic/social concern reps, this entails connecting with members of your demographic and the structures within the University designed to address them, such as the Office of Multicultural Affairs, Parent and Family Programs, CAPS, Wellness and Health Promotion, etc.
