Item	Details	Education Abroad Program Cost (USD)
<b>Application Fee</b>	If applicable, paid directly to Program Provider.	
<b>Technology Fee</b>	Whether studying on campus at Seattle University or abroad, students are billed this fee during Summer term. (\$214 Seattle U/\$321 Cornish)	<b>214/321</b>
<b>Wellness Fee</b>	Whether studying on campus at Seattle University or abroad, students are billed this fee during Summer term. (\$177 Seattle U/ \$266 Cornish)	<b>177/266</b>
<b>Education Abroad Transfer Articulation Fee</b>	Students studying abroad on Non-SU programs will be billed \$1000/program. This cost appears on your MySeattleU bill.	<b>1000</b>
<b>Non-SU Tuition</b>	Students will pay Program Provider directly for all program tuition and fees.	
<b>Books/Materials</b>	A good estimate is \$300 per term if information is not provided.	
<b>Housing</b>	Cost of housing varies by program and housing type.	
<b>Food</b>	Cost of food varies by program and personal eating habits.	
<b>Airfare</b>	Estimate cost of roundtrip ticket to program location. Search the web or consult a travel agent for actual price.	
<b>Local Transportation</b>	Local transportation could include bus fare, trains, taxis, etc.	
<b>Personal Spending</b>	Personal spending depends on lifestyle and may include toiletries, clothing, nights out, souvenirs, etc.	
<b>Medical/Travel Insurance</b>	Most programs include Global Medical Insurance in the overall program cost. If insurance is not included, estimate an additional expense of \$1.71/day.	
<b>Passport</b>	\$135 for a new passport and \$110 to renew (only if needed). The expiration date must be at least six months after scheduled return from program location.	
<b>Visa</b>	Cost of visa plus required photos, documents, and/or travel expenses to and from the nearest consulate.
