Item	Details	Cost (USD)
Application Fee	If applicable, paid directly to Program Provider.	
Technology Fee	Whether studying on campus at Seattle University or abroad, students are billed this fee during Summer term. (\$214 Seattle U/\$321 Cornish)	214/321
Wellness Fee	Whether studying on campus at Seattle University or abroad, students are billed this fee during Summer term. (\$177 Seattle U/ \$266 Cornish)	177/266
Education Abroad Transfer Articulation Fee	Students studying abroad on Non-SU programs will be billed \$1000/program. This cost appears on your MySeattleU bill.	1000
Non-SU Tuition	Students will pay Program Provider directly for all program tuition and fees.	
Books/Materials	A good estimate is \$300 per term if information is not provided.	
Housing	Cost of housing varies by program and housing type.	
Food	Cost of food varies by program and personal eating habits.	
Airfare	Estimate cost of roundtrip ticket to program location. Search the web or consult a travel agent for actual price.	
Local Transportation	Local transportation could include bus fare, trains, taxis, etc.	
Personal Spending	Personal spending depends on lifestyle and may include toiletries, clothing, nights out, souvenirs, etc.	
Medical/Travel Insurance	Most programs include Global Medical Insurance in the overall program cost. If insurance is not included, estimate an additional expense of \$1.71/day.	
Passport	\$135 for a new passport and \$110 to renew (only if needed). The expiration date must be at least six months after scheduled return from program location.	
Visa	Cost of visa plus required photos, documents, and/or travel expenses to and from the nearest consulate.

Emergency funds	Recommended to allocate \$500 for emergencies.	500

Item	Details	Amount (USD)
