1. Laptop requirements and recommendations

As a student in Graphic Design, Interaction Design, or Illustration, your laptop is a key tool for success. You'll use it with creative software, for projects, research, and presentations. We've put together guidelines for selecting a computer that meets the needs of your coursework—including minimum specifications and suggested models.

If you have questions or need clarification, please reach out to your <u>admissions</u> <u>counselor</u> or department coordinator, <u>Sarah Lenoue</u>.

If you need financial assistance with purchasing a laptop, please contact your <u>financial aid counselor</u> to explore available options. Some students may be able to borrow an additional \$3,000 through private loans or Parent PLUS loans for their first year.

a. Tech requirements

You will need:

- → A laptop (Apple or PC) that meets or exceeds the specifications detailed below. A mouse is also recommended.
- → <u>A subscription to Adobe Creative Cloud</u> (Student and Teacher Edition). Avoid using bootleg software or open-source alternatives unless directed by your studio faculty.
- → An external SSD for file storage and backup (e.g., <u>Transcend 2 TB USB 3.0</u> or equivalent) for file storage and backup.

Additionally, you may consider investing in a mouse (for using design and illustration software), an external monitor (for your dorm or personal space), and a tablet. These are not required, but if you already have them or can afford them (new or refurbished), they will make your work easier and more enjoyable.

b. Choosing a Laptop computer

Not all laptops are designed for design work. Laptops intended for web browsing or office tasks may not provide the performance required for creative applications like Photoshop, Illustrator, After Effects, and Blender. Choose models designed for creative professionals or gaming, as these typically offer the performance you'll need.

 \rightarrow For **2D** (graphic design or illustration) work, integrated graphics should suffice, but note that your needs may increase over time.

 \rightarrow For **3D**, motion graphics, or video editing, choose a laptop with a dedicated graphics card (GPU).

c. Laptop recommendations

APPLE LAPTOP RECOMMENDATIONS

Apple laptops, when configured for design work, tend to be more expensive, but they are optimized for performance with excellent build quality. If you're accustomed to macOS and use an iPad for drawing, this might be the right choice.

We do not recommend the MacBook Air models for students planning to work with high-res video, 3D software, motion graphics, or games.

- → Optional: <u>iPad</u>, several models from \$329 or \$27.41/mo. For 12mo. At Apple Education Store

Notes + tips

- → If purchasing a refurbished laptop, ensure you include a warranty. (Cornish IT cannot service defective computers.)
- → Prices are subject to change, so be sure to shop around for the best deal.

Not required—but recommended—accessories

- → Very recommended: a mouse, like Logitech G305 Lightspeed (Wireless), \$59.99
- → Optional: external monitor (for dorm or personal space) like <u>Dell UltraSharp 24</u> <u>Monitor U2424H</u>, \$254.99
- → Optional: Screenless Pen Tablets connected to your laptop (e.g. <u>Wacom</u> or <u>Huion</u> pen tablets): examples: <u>Framework 12</u>, <u>Wacom</u> or <u>Huion</u> Pen Displays (expensive)

2. Supplies and materials for the first year studios

You are expected to purchase supplies for your studio courses, similar to how you would buy textbooks. These tools will be useful throughout your time at Cornish. Additional materials may be required throughout the year based on specific classes or projects. Be sure to have everything ready before the start of classes.

You will be expected to purchase additional materials and supplies throughout the year for specific classes, projects, or personal work outside of class.

Make sure to get all of these before the start of classes, and have them available for your first studio course.

If you are a transfer student and won't be taking classes in any of the first year studios, you will certainly need a laptop, but you can wait till to hear from your instructors what materials they expect you to have. Anyway, from the complete list below, we marked with an asterisk the ones that we recommend you to have ready, for you most certainly will need them at some point.

Kit options

We work with <u>Blick Art Materials</u> to get some purchasing options and discounts for incoming students. Blick Art Materials created a number of kits complete with all the items on the list. The kits will be sold based on a first-come, first-served basis.

1. Recommended—Pick up at Blick or Cornish (during orientation week): \$234.99 + Tax Buy the complete kit online at any time and pick it up at Blick's Capitol Hill store, or on Cornish's main campus during orientation week (ask your <u>admissions counselor</u> for the date in which the kits will be delivered at campus).

2. Online purchase through Blick—\$265.61 + tax.

Complete list of materials purchased on your own—up to \$289.97 + tax, before 10% student discount.

This is the shelf tag price in store if you purchase each item individually: Prices are not guaranteed, as well as availability.

Consider this option if you already have many supplies like rulers, scissors, art bins, etc., and focus on getting paper, paints, and other consumable materials. We strongly recommend sticking to the brands and sizes of paper recommended here, especially Holbein gouache set, as it will best support your understanding of standard color reproduction practices.
