### University Update: Tim Leary, Executive Vice President, Cabinet liaison

- 300 new employees since March 2020 so many who have never before been physically on campus
- In discussion of student experience, a huge emphasis is placed on staff influence
- Professional Formation for staff 80 employment openings, most are staff competitive market
- How to create environment to be attractive, and how to overcome struggles to retain employees
- Challenge in keeping up with shifting COVID protocols from local authorities, e.g. how to handle exemptions?
- Vaccinated: faculty/staff in 90 percentages, students in the 80 percentages
- Flex Work Plan difficult for many to return to campus every VP needs to submit plans to HR.
